NEW – MHRA supports launch of Innovate UK's first-of-its-kind initiative to fund new Regulatory Science and Innovation Networks

Launched yesterday (Wednesday 13 December) by Innovate UK, the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) has joined partners across government including the Office for Life Sciences to provide support and invite academic institutions in the UK to apply to become a member of a Regulatory Science and Innovation Network. In a drive to proactively deliver agile and robust regulatory pathways and guidance to support the innovators of today and tomorrow, the MHRA has helped shape the design of this programme with partners across government, which will enable research informing the future of UK regulatory practice.

NEW – Patient safety boost as medical associates to be regulated

Physician associates and anaesthesia associates will soon be regulated by the General Medical Council, improving patient safety and supporting plans to expand medical associate roles in the NHS to relieve pressure on doctors and GPs. The government will lay legislation this week to allow the GMC to begin the process of regulating medical associates, who are medically trained healthcare professionals who work alongside doctors to care for patients. **Read more here**.

NEW - Booking a jab "as easy as booking a cab" in NHS App overhaul

The NHS is setting out how it will increase national uptake of lifesaving vaccinations, ensuring millions more people receive protection against a range of diseases. Published today, the ambitious NHS vaccination strategy will outline how getting vaccinations will be made easier than ever before, including through expansion of the NHS App, 'one stop shops' and community outreach.
