
Based in the Midlands, a region home to the UK's largest concentration of medical technology businesses, world leading academic and clinical facilities, Medilink Midlands is part of, and serves one of the greatest health and life sciences clusters. A region possessing many key strengths surrounding life sciences and medtech, supporting over 33,000 jobs and an economic worth of more than £200bn a year.¹

The Midlands remains at the forefront of innovation, driven by its universities, hospitals, and businesses. This innovation ensures our region remains at the forefront of promoting better health outcomes and nurturing a thriving life science industry.

In 2022, Medilink Midlands reached out to industry members to ascertain barriers (foreseen and experienced) that prevented them from expediting the development and adoption of medtech innovations into the NHS. The following report reveals the ongoing barriers and challenges companies are facing to market entry and/or growing their businesses.

This survey provides an understanding of what the sector is experiencing, their challenges and ambitions for the future.

The survey was open to members and non-members of the life sciences, medtech and healthcare sector. We actively promoted the survey directly with our membership community and wider network for inclusivity across the sector. The results and opinions represent the Midlands and wider regions, receiving the highest percentage of responders from those based in the East Midlands - 32%, 19% - West Midlands, 22% from those based in the East of England and 27% - Other UK regions.




Expanding markets


In 2024, a key focus for Medilink Midlands was the exploration of opportunities and growth potential, international collaborations could offer. The survey was used to establish how the sector is currently exporting, the ambitions and challenges.

36% of responders are currently exporting, with 64% wanting to do so, with 50% looking for Distributors, Importers and Authorised Representatives across varying countries.


41% already have, or are interested in a satellite office or part of business outside of the UK, with sales and marketing the most popular consideration, followed by technical support.


